Post Brexit: Visiting Europe

FROM 1ST JANUARY 2021

Checks ahead of travel



Validity of your passport - On the day you travel, your passport will need to have at least 6 months left and be less than 10 years old.



Visa requirements - You may need a visa or work permit dependent on your length of stay, type of business activity, entry requirements and rules of the country you're visiting.



Border control – UK passport holders may no longer be able to use certain passport and security queues. It may also be a requirement to provide return/onward tickets and demonstrate you have adequate funds for the period of your stay.



Driving documentation – If you're planning to drive your own vehicle, you will need a green card and a GB sticker. You may also need an international driving permit (IDP) to drive in some EU countries.



Healthcare cover — EHIC or GHIC will be valid as long as it's in date and you're travelling to an EU country. If travelling to Switzerland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein, you should get appropriate travel insurance with healthcare cover before you travel.



Mobile data roaming – Free mobile phone roaming throughout the EU is no longer guaranteed. Check with your phone operator for data roaming charges.
